A motion was made by Susie Paddack and seconded by Pam Kimbrough to dissolve our Neighborhood Watch immediately and obtain the signs from residents. Motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was opened for public comment. Discussion and questions were presented by residents regarding the upcoming security contract.
